The AB 1802 review for the following material(s) has been completed:

- **Daily Practice Program**

Assembly Bill (AB) 1802, of the Statutes of 2006, provides one-time funding of \$30 million to school districts to purchase standards-aligned instructional materials for English learner (EL) students in kindergarten and grades one through twelve. The purpose of the funds is for districts to purchase supplementary instructional materials "to accelerate the pupils as rapidly as possible towards grade-level proficiency in reading, writing, and speaking English." The materials may only be used in addition to the standards-aligned materials adopted by the State Board of Education (SBE). We are happy to inform you that **your materials have been certified** for alignment with the identified English Language Arts (ELA) and English Language Development (ELD) standards.

Your materials were reviewed at one of the two contracted County Offices of Education. The review panel consisted of credentialed teachers who had expertise in the Reading/Language Arts (R/LA) Framework, the ELA Content Standards, and the ELD Standards for California public schools. These panel members represented a full range of grade-level expertise in elementary, middle, and high school teaching experience.

Reviewers used the correlation matrices that your company completed and reviewed the citations to verify the standards, which were identified in the matrices. The team also used the proficiency levels, and the ELA domains identified in the matrices to ensure that the materials were substantially correlated to the cited ELA and ELD standards.

Apportionment letters will be mailed in December 2007 to all Local Educational Agencies (LEA) who submitted "Intent to Purchase" and/or "Request to Review" forms to the California Department of Education. Districts will then begin the process of purchasing supplemental materials that have been added to the approved



AB 1802 Certified List. LEAs have until June 30, 2009, to encumber the funds; hence many districts may postpone purchasing until the 2008-09 fiscal year.
